

ROBBERS CHOKE, BIND AND GAG THEIR VICTIM

Joseph Eisenstadt Is Expected to Die from Treatment.

UNCONSCIOUS IN HALL.

Ropes About His Hands and Feet Were Arranged in a Noose About Neck.

Assaulted by five men, robbed of \$300 in cash and a gold watch and chain and a diamond ring, Joseph Eisenstadt, of No. 25 Market street, was seized and bound with a clothline and left unconscious in the hallway of a tenement at No. 44 Allen street early to-day. He revived and his groans aroused the janitor of the tenement, who called the police. Eisenstadt was cut loose and brought into unconsciousness after closing his eyes and mouth. He was removed to Gouverneur Hospital.

Eisenstadt, who came here from Mirsk, Poland, four years ago, had accumulated \$1,000 by working sixteen hours a day as a cloth presser and, after his health broke down, became a diamond peddler. He has been trying to raise \$5,000 to return to his native town to start up a hotel for the purchase of a business from his father-in-law, and to leave a row of tenement-houses. He had called on a relative last night to borrow money and was returning home through Attorney street, which is parallel to the Second avenue "L" structure, when he was attacked from the rear by five men. One man struck him on the head. Another doubled him up with a kick in the stomach and a third knocked him unconscious with a blow in the neck. When Eisenstadt recovered consciousness he was bound hand and foot and lying in a dark hallway.

Julius Brotski, who lives on the second floor, heard moans in the lower hallway. He notified the janitor, who, with a lantern, discovered the man lying near the front door. His hands were tied behind him, his feet were securely fastened and the same rope was wound around his neck. The binding cord was cut in ship hoose, and when the victim attempted to move the rope became tighter.

The janitor immediately ran out and notified Policeman Kosky, of the Broadway street station. He cut the strings binding the man and released him. Eisenstadt had been almost choked to death. He muttered his name and address and then became insensible. An ambulance was summoned from Gouverneur Hospital, and after Dr. Mansford had examined the patient he said his chances for recovery were slim. He was taken to the institution in his condition. A pocket were found a bunch of keys, a pearl ring, \$2 in cash and some letters. One of these showed that he had just pocketed a deposit of \$50 on a store in Brooklyn, where he intended opening business.

SCHMITTBERGER'S TRIAL DELAYED.

Counsel for Accused Inspector Gets Time to Prepare His Defense.

Police and witnesses crowded trial chamber at Police Headquarters to-day for the trial of Inspector Max Schmittberger, charged with neglect of duty and other offenses while in charge of the Tenderloin section. The accused inspector, in full uniform, sat at the rear of the room, while in the front benches was a double row of patrolmen against whom Schmittberger had at one time or another filed charges. The Schmittberger case was the first on the calendar, but the inspector's counsel, George Wines, asked for more time to prepare his defense, and the postponement was taken until next Wednesday.



MAN DROPS DEAD AT RESTAURANT TABLE.

Henry B. Bruce, Civil Engineer, Had Entered Downtown Eating House to Order Breakfast.

Henry B. Bruce, a civil engineer, of No. 48 West One Hundred and Fiftieth street, dropped dead from apoplexy to-day in a restaurant at No. 48 Cortlandt street. He left his office at No. 25 Cortlandt street, for breakfast, and seating himself at a table, called for a glass of water.

He suddenly gave a cry of pain and fell over unconscious on the floor. He died a few minutes after being taken upstairs. Dr. Leslie, of Hudson Street Hospital, pronounced him dead.

Mr. Bruce was about forty years old, and had a wife and child, who are visiting in Waukegan, Wis. He had apparently been in good health.

At the home of Mr. Bruce it was said to-day that Mrs. Bruce and her five-year-old son, named in Waukegan, Wis. May, when Mrs. Bruce's mother died suddenly, shock and bad health have rendered Mrs. Bruce's condition such that it is feared she will not be able to rear up under the sudden death of her husband.

STEAMER SLOAN LEFT PASSENGERS MAROONED.

Leak in Boilers Forced Quick Landing, Then Captain Paid Fares Back to City.

POISONER AT WORK ON BRONX ANIMALS

Suspicious Death of Jaguar and Illness of Lion and Leopard in Park.

AUTOPSY WILL BE HELD.

Officials Disclaim the Theory, but Belief Is Held that Laborer Seeks Revenge.

That somebody is giving poison to the animals in Bronx Zoological Park is a suspicion growing out of the death of a jaguar and the illness of Rajah, the Nubian lion, and of a clouded leopard. An autopsy will be performed on the body of the jaguar to-day by Dr. Blair, the park physician. Neither he nor any other of the officials will admit the poison theory. H. R. Mitchell, acting director during the illness of Rajah, said: "We don't believe there is any poisoning being done. Still, we will know when we have examined the jaguar's body. I think he died of natural causes and that Rajah and the leopard are simply indisposed."

The sickness of Rajah followed three days after he had scratched an Italian laborer. The man had tried to put the big beast and Rajah showed his hand severely. The man went away cursing loudly.

When Rajah was taken ill the suspicion was that the Italian had got revenge by poisoning him. For two nights Dr. Blair and a keeper stayed by the big animal and at one time it was likely that he would die. To-day, though, he is on the road to recovery. The clouded leopard's sickness is not so severe.

Mr. Mitchell denied that one of the wildcats escaped yesterday and was shot after it munched a keeper's hand. He said that it was a domestic cat that was harrying the birds of the park. One of the rules, he said, is to shoot all house cats that come into the park.

ACCIDENT VICTIMS DEAD.

One Was Rolled Between Wagons, the Other Fell Downstairs.

James Bowey died to-day in the Hudson Street Hospital from injuries sustained a week ago by being rolled between two wagons at West Broadway and Murray street. Bowey, who lived in Sixty-first street near Eleventh avenue, was crossing West Broadway when he was caught between two wagons going in opposite directions. Several of his ribs were broken and he sustained fatal internal injuries.
