SAGE CAVE TO WIFE \$10,000,000 BEFORE DEATH

The determination of certain of the Sage heirs to contest the will leaving them \$2,000,000 each was strengthened to-day by a report made so plain that a short time before his death Russell Sage presented outright to his wife the sum of \$10,000,000 in cash. This munificent gift tends to explain to some extent the difference between the size of the Sage estate as estimated by Mrs. Sage's lawyers and as was estimated by Wall Street authorities, among the latter Henry Clews.

Gifts May Explain Apparent Shrinkage in Fortune.
