EIGHTY-TWO BABIES SAVED FROM DEATH. Health Department Figures Show Evening World's Crusade Has Been of Great Benefit.

The lives of eighty-two babies were saved last week as a result of the efforts of the Evening World in daily urging upon mothers the necessity of giving their children clean milk, clean air and clean bodies. According to the official figures of the Board of Health the deaths from diarrhoeal diseases among babies under five numbered 82, while for the corresponding week of last year they aggregated 84.
