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PLOUGHED UP GRAVES OF BRYAN'S PARENTS.

Ohio Farmer Stopped by Courts from Desecrating Cemetery Near Youngstown.

YOUNGSTOWN, O., Sept. 21.—Charged with ploughing over the graves of the parents of William J. Bryan and others and using the gravestones for walks in his farmyard, George W. Ryder, a farmer at Ryder's Den, near here, was brought to court to-day on complaint of Mary Herron.

During the campaign of 1896 Mr. Bryan while here went to Ryder's Den and tried to locate the graves of his parents, who were buried there, but could not identify them. He had hoped to remove them as the Ryder's Den cemetery had long been abandoned. Mrs. Herron has brought the injunction against Ryder, claiming that when the cemetery was abandoned, it was to be left undisturbed. Ryder bought it and began ploughing it over to transform it into a farm.

REFUSES TO TELL WHO SHOT HIM.

Police Arrest Man in Hospital Who Has Unaccounted-For Bullet in Leg.

With a bullet in his leg, John Kern, thirty years old, of No. 1 Corlies street, was held at the Madison street police station as a suspicious person, because he refused to tell the police how he had been injured.

According to the police, Kern went to Gouverneur Hospital last night and told the doctors that he had been shot in the leg. He refused to tell how he had been injured, and the doctors held Kern and sent for the police.

The police at the Madison street station say that from what they have learned from Delany street station they believe Kern and some other men went out to shoot cats with revolvers and he was shot in the leg by a companion.
