HINTS FOR THE HOME

Cream of Peanut Soup. ADD half a pint of peanut butter to one quart of boiling milk, season with a little bay leaf, a little salt, spoonful of grated onion. Cook for six minutes in a double boiler, and then thicken with one tablespoonful of flour or cornstarch, moistened in a little cold milk. Cook until smooth, strain through a fine sieve and serve at once with croutons made of entire wheat bread.

Muffins. ONE pint of flour and two teaspoons of baking powder sifted together into a bowl; add pinch of salt and a tablespoon of sugar. Beat one egg in a cup and then stir into the flour; add one cup of milk and beat all thoroughly together. Pour in one tablespoonful of melted lard and then put the mixture into hot greased tins. Bake in a hot oven until brown.




