

CONVICTS IN PANIC AT FIRE IN SING SING

Screamed and Cursed as Cabinet Shop Burned.

WERE LOCKED IN CELLS.

Keepers Had Hard Time Quietening Them as Blaze Lighted Place.

Convicts in Sing Sing prison are excited to-day over a fire which destroyed the cabinet shop in the north yard last night.

The fire, which broke out at about 10 o'clock in the night, was caused by a candle which had been left burning in the cabinet shop.

The cabinet shop is a three-story brick building, 100 feet long and forty feet wide. It was filled with dry wood, paint and varnish.

The fire spread rapidly and in a few minutes the flames were visible from the street. The inmates of the prison were locked in their cells.

The fire was extinguished by the fire department at about 1 o'clock in the morning. The damage done is estimated at \$50,000.
