

MICE FIRE FLAT MENACING SEVEN SLEEPERS' LIVES

Police Hero Rescues Family Overcome by Smoke in Rooms.

Mischievous mice are suspected of starting a fire in the large-story apartment house at No. 250 West 11th street, early today, in which seven persons came near losing their lives.

The fire broke out in the second story, where it was caused by a mouse which had gnawed its way into a window and thrown it open before striking to the floor overcome by the stifling smoke.

Policeman Wrightman of the Bedford avenue station, chanced to see Bradley as he opened the window in the cloud of smoke. He turned in an alarm and snatched his way through bolted doors into the burning building. He could see no flames, but the halls were dense with smoke.

On the top floor Wrightman battered in the door leading to the Bradley apartments. Near the threshold he stumbled over the form of Bradley. He dragged him out into the hall near an open window and then ran back to rescue other members of the family.

He grabbed the senseless forms of Mrs. Bradley and her baby of a few months and carried them into the street. Then, rushing back, he found Bradley on his feet and together they managed to carry out the other four children, all of whom were unconscious.

Mean time the firemen had come on. Wrightman had just reached the foot of the stairs on the ground floor when the grateable policeman had carried him into the street after they had passed out the two children he had attempted to get out in safety.

The fire did little damage, as it was confined to the floor in which it started.

TWO SLAYERS OF GEN. BARILLAS FOUND GUILTY

Morales and Mora Sentenced to Death Despite Plea for Clemency.

MEXICO CITY, June 6.—Florence Morales and Bernardo Mora have been found guilty of murdering Gen. Manuel Barillas, former President of the Republic of Guatemala, in this city on the night of April 3.

The jury which returned the verdict was out one hour and forty minutes. Upon the announcement of the verdict the attorneys for the accused asked for clemency, citing a provision for twenty years imprisonment. The court took the matter under advisement, and in thirty minutes returned, pronouncing the death sentence.

The prisoners evinced no emotion when their doom was pronounced. No date has been set for execution as yet.

BOLD THIEF OPERATES IN PARK ROW CROWD.

Snatches Watch, but is Captured After Chase Through City Hall Park.

At the station the prisoner said he was William Marcus, of No. 1506 Bath avenue, Hempstead, but when stood up at Headquarters later in the morning he was identified as Isaac Friedman, whose picture is in the gallery.


