Track Removal Association Asks McClellan to Spread His Cards on the Table.

The Eleventh Avenue Track Removal Association, through its President, Mrs. Jane Delaney, has addressed a letter to Mayor McClellan demanding to know if he is opposed to the removal of the New York Central tracks on Eleventh avenue, and pointing out to him that if he is taking this stand against the

BUCKET SHOPS QUIT BOSTON.
BOSTON, June 14.—The Anti-Bucket Shop bill which was passed by the present session of the Massachusetts Legislature has become a law. As a result nearly forty so-called bucket shops in Boston with their various branches throughout the State closed to-day. The penalty is \$1,000 fine or one year imprisonment.
