

POLICEMAN IS KNOCKED DOWN BY SPEEDING AUTO

Callahan, Dying in Hospital, With Skull, Both Shoulders and Nose Broken.

MACHINE SPEEDS AWAY

Rich Contractor and Friend With Him Arrested Later at City Island.

With a fractured skull, both shoulders and nose broken and contusions all over the body, William Callahan, a policeman of Pelham Manor, is in the New Rochelle Hospital in a critical condition today following his attempt to arrest the occupants of an automobile said to have been going along the shore road in Pelham Manor at a speed of forty-five miles an hour.

The occupants of the car, said to be William McCord, a contractor, of Greenwich, Conn., and P. J. Kane, of Larchmont, sped on after running down the policeman, and were not arrested until they reached the entrance of the New York Athletic Club at Travers Island.

They were going so rapidly there that when Pelham Martin Conlon ordered them to stop they had to ditch their machine, both being thrown out, but escaping injury. They were taken before Judge Edgar Beersoff and released on \$500 bail pending the result of Callahan's injuries.

Callahan was one of a squad of policemen detailed to arrest scoundrels, against whom Pelham Manor has for some time been waging war. The Shore Road has been a favorite place for the scoundrels, and the means adopted to stop them is said to have aroused their resentment. The officers have been in the habit of hiding behind trees and suddenly jumping out to arrest those they think are exceeding the speed limit.

Callahan sprung out yesterday as the McCord auto approached and ordered the driver to stop. He didn't halt, and the policeman was struck and knocked into the ditch. Instead of slowing up and returning to assist the injured man the occupants of the car increased their speed.

All efforts to locate McCord and Kane and get their version as to why they didn't stop after running down the officer were unavailing, but they insisted to Judge Beersoff they did not strike Callahan intentionally, and cited as proof of their desire to obey the law the ditching of their machine at serious risk of themselves when Conlon ordered them to halt. Both are members of the New York Athletic Club and of numerous yacht clubs along the Sound. The automobile is said to be the property of McCord.

Callahan is still unconscious to-day, and is said to have small chance of recovery.
