

HAU, DISGUISED, IS IDENTIFIED BY MAN IN COURT

Accused Professor Forced to Don Beard He Wore Before Murder Was Done.

FREE WITH ADMISSIONS.

Prisoner on Trial for Killing of Mother-in-Law Changes His Tactics.

KARLSRUHE, Germany, July 18.—The trial of Karl Hau, formerly Professor of Roman law in George Washington University, Washington, D. C., on the charge of having murdered his mother-in-law, Frau Muller, in Baden, on Nov. 6 of last year, was resumed here to-day.

Hau appeared in the court-room looking as cheerful and confident as yesterday. He surprised the Court by making important admissions concerning incidents of which he had hitherto refused to speak.

The Judge inquired whether or not he had sent it off, but this Hau declined to answer. He also refused to say whether his wife was aware that this message had been sent.

Philip Uhlig, a merchant of Frankfort-on-the-Maine, testified he saw a man on Nov. 6 in the Frankfort railroad station wearing a false beard and mustache. The Judge here asked Hau to put on similar disguise and Uhlig then recognized him as the same man.

C. A. Batters, a newspaper man of Constantinople, testified that while Hau was in the Turkish capital he played the role of a man of wealth. He spent money lavishly, chartered a yacht, organized revels at a hotel with dancing girls, and boasted of his wild life as a student.

Frau Mueller, a sister of Hau's stepmother, testified that she accompanied Hau senior to London. Upon hearing of the arrest of Hau she had an interview with him in prison. She found him much altered and in a state of great mental excitement.

SAVANNAH LINER BURNED, BUT NO LIVES ARE LOST

Passengers and Crew Rescued by Soldiers as Allegheny Is Destroyed.

SAVANNAH, July 18.—The steamship Allegheny burned last night two miles off Tybee Island. All the thirty-two passengers and the crew were saved, but the ship, her cargo and all the baggage on board are a total loss.

The fire was discovered amidships at 10 o'clock, two hours after the steamer left her pier here, the engineers and firemen being driven from their work by a blast of smoke. In this crippled condition the Allegheny began to drift, her course being toward the beach.
