MUTUAL LIFE HAS SOLD CONTROL OF TRUST COMPANY

Disposes of Shares in the Fifth Avenue to Representatives of Present Management.


The Mutual Life Insurance Company has sold its controlling interest in the Fifth Avenue Trust Company, a \$30,000,000 concern, to a group of capitalists representing the present management of the trust company. This is the first instance of one of the great insurance corporations complying with the new law, which went into effect in January, which compels insurance companies to rid themselves of subsidiary enterprises within five years.

The new owners of the trust company are practically the same as those in control of the Morton Trust Company. Levi P. Morton is president of each concern. They will not be merged, however, but will work together.

The Mutual still controls the Guarantee Trust and the United States Mortgage and Trust Companies. The officers of the Fifth Avenue concern are Mr. Morton, William D. Soans, first vice-president, and Cecil D. Landale, second vice-president. Its capital is \$1,000,000, its surplus and undivided profits are \$1,742,365, and it has \$16,889,962 in deposits. It pays 12 per cent dividends, and its stock is quoted at \$65.
