





DURNELL'S STRING IS SOLD



Billy Dubois Pays \$14,000 for Nealon, the Suburban Winner.

SARATOGA RACE TRACK, N. Y., Aug. 16.—Thirty-three thousand and two hundred dollars was the sum total paid for the entire racing stable of "Boots" Durnell, sold at noon here to-day in the

padlock of the Spack track. This string has won more than \$100,000 in bets for John W. Gates, who is now in Europe spending some of the money having a good time.

A representative crowd of horsemen gathered around the rapid enclosure when Auctioneer Easton started off with the sale of yearlings. The star of the sale was No. 50, winner of the Suburban Handicap. He was sold to Billy Dubois, the club-house commissioner, who bought Charles Edward for \$2,000 during the Sheepshead Bay meeting.

Jacobite, the good three-year-old sprinter and brother of Charles Edward, went to Pittsburgh for \$5,000. Elison also bid in Tennessee for \$4,000.

The star of the yearlings was bought by Paul Remy for \$5,100. The youngster is a chestnut colt, half-brother to Deming and Chapinpec, by Imp Star Ruby, out of Graciously. Jack McGinnis bought the first of the yearlings offered, a bay colt by Ben Stronem, for \$2,000.

Joe Nealon, a promising two-year-old, brought only \$2,000, at which figure he looks cheap. The other prices were comparatively small.

The sale marks the farewell appearance of Durnell on the American turf. It is said he will be taking in England as a trainer and manager for John W. Gates.


