

MITOISTS WHO KILLED A GIRL ARE ACQUITTED

Dury Finds Brinsmade and Chauffeur Not to Blame for Fatal Crash.

TOMS RIVER, N. J., Oct. 18.—Louis E. Brinsmade, of New York, and his chauffeur, Joseph Landers, were acquitted this evening of the charge of manslaughter, based on the death of Laura Brown, eight years old, of Mount Pleasant, Pa.

An automobile which Brinsmade and Landers were running collided with a truck in which the child's father and his family were near Barnegat on Route 1 last. The child was so badly hurt she died.

The Browns accused the New York man of recklessness. The latter said that when they saw the Browns' car come around a bend they slowed down, but Brown put on power and was responsible for the accident.

Considerable technical testimony was taken and among the witnesses were J. Phillips, of the Washington Company, and C. E. Roehl, chief engineer of the Brooklyn Rapid-Transit Company.

Mr. C. Bowers, of Barnegat, testified that while in the house of the Browns he saw the Browns' car. Mrs. Brown said to her husband: "You did not turn out when I called." To this Mr. Brown responded, according to Mrs. Bowers, "I had been turning out all day and was tired of it."

This testimony was emphatically denied by the Browns.


