The robin's breast was white instead of red, and there were beautiful white markings about its wings. It did not associate with any other birds.  
A little girl found it dead in Fairmount avenue and the children of the town buried it.

**OKLAHOMA'S ONLY FORGOT ONE THING.**  
President Roosevelt has one objection to the new constitution of Oklahoma. Senator R. L. Owen, of the new State, met the President last evening.  
"I only have this criticism," said Mr. Roosevelt, "to offer your constitution this to describe the kind of tooth powder a true Oklahoman should use. Why this omission when you regulated everything else under the sun?"



