AMERICAN STOCKS GAIN IN THE LONDON MARKET.

English Bankers Will Get Gold From Paris to Offset the Drain by United States.

LONDON, Nov. 4.—Trading on the Stock Exchange today started well, operators being cheered by the announcement that gold shipments from

Paris to London were being arranged. Led by Consols, which rose 3/8, most of the gilt edged securities benefited by the promised assistance from France.

Inquiries made in the bullion market show that the brokers expect the Paris shipments of gold to London to be fairly considerable. They also express the opinion that the outflow of gold to America from London will continue for some time, even if the Bank of England's discount rate is raised to 7 per cent. It is pointed out, however, that if such a rate becomes necessary it is bound to attract gold from other sources, thus offsetting the American drain.

It is further remarked that the Bank of England's discount rate has not been above 6 per cent. since 1873, when, on Nov. 7 of that year, as the result of a panic in the Stock Exchange, the rate was put up to 8 per cent.

PARIS, Nov. 4.—The Bank of France today made its first shipment of gold to the Bank of England in order to relieve the tension there caused by the American drain.

The United States this afternoon purchased another consignment of bar gold, amounting to \$500,000, from the Bank of England.


Canada also took \$5,000 in sovereigns, presumably a large quantity of gold will be shipped to New York to-morrow on the White Star line steamer Oceanic.
