

# GOVERNOR AND BINGHAM TALK OVER BLUE LAW

### Aldermanic Committee's Hearing on Modifying Ordinance Set for 11 o'Clock.

Gov. Hughes and Police Commissioner Bingham conferred last night on the Sunday blue law problem.

That the Governor was interested in the situation was first made known when he met the Commissioner at the Hotel Astor by appointment. They remained in earnest conversation for fifteen minutes. The Commissioner seemed to be doing most of the talking and appeared to be explaining the situation, the Governor satisfying himself with asking questions.

Practically every element of New York's population will be represented at the meeting in the City Hall at 11 o'clock to-day when the Law Committee of the Board of Aldermen holds a hearing on the question of Sunday amusements. The meeting is expected to be one of the largest ever held in the Board of Aldermen's chamber.

Delegations will be present representing the various theatrical associations, churches and church organizations, organized labor will have several speakers talk on the advisability of more liberal laws and there will be scores of individual speakers ready to tell the meeting their personal views.

The Eugen Mueser has obtained a temporary injunction from Justice Truax, in the Supreme Court, to restrain the police from interfering with the conduct of its business next Sunday. Besides this injunction, it is probable that about five hundred moving picture shows and nickelodeons in Manhattan and Brooklyn will keep their doors open under similar court orders. No theatre will be open.

A meeting of the moving picture show and nickelodeon proprietors was held last evening in the Gilsey House to fight the Sunday "blue law." It was learned that the proposal to obtain injunctions against the police was most favorably considered. Another meeting will be held this evening or to-morrow morning.


