



SPECIAL RACE FEATURES FOR NEW YORK A. C. GAMES

The annual indoor games of the New York Athletic Club, to be held at Madison Square Garden Tuesday evening, March 10, will bring together one of the greatest gatherings of athletes ever entered in an indoor meet. In addition to a lengthy programme of relay races and handicap events several special races have been arranged that attract the fastest runners in the Amateur Athletic Union and the colleges.

The special 1,000-yard run is another event that will provide a great contest. Negotiations are now pending, and will probably be shortly completed, for the entry of H. E. Coe, of Michigan, the Western and intercollegiate champion in this event. This year's contest will include H. P. Ramsey, the Chicago Athletic Club crack; Guy Haskins, of Pennsylvania; and Melvin W. Sheppard, of the Irish-American Athletic Club. This quartet of runners represent the full range of middle distance runners in the country.

John J. Kelly, the Western phenomenon in the mile, has entered the broad jump, and will be opposed by J. P. O'Connell, of the New York A. C., and probably Cook, the Cornell crack. Kelly will also compete in the 60-yard (scratch) dash, and will be opposed by Nat Cartmell, the Pennsylvania and intercollegiate champion; Charles J. Seitz, New York A. C.; and W. D. Eaton, of Cambridge.

With Forrest Smithson, of the Metropolitan A. C., who won the A. U. championship; John C. Garrella, of Michigan University, who captured the intercollegiate championship; and A. H. Shaw, of Dartmouth, who was second in the mile, the New York A. C. will have a hard race, this event gives every indication of being the greatest ever held in the country.
