

FALLS TO DEATH AT BOTTOM OF ELEVATOR SHAFT

English "Remittance Man," a Bowery Lodger, Found Under Car.

J. Edgar Duff, a "remittance man" of a good English family, who had been living in Bowery lodger-houses, was found dead today at the foot of the elevator shaft in the left building at No. 40 Pearl street, near Park Row. His identity was established by letters found in his pockets from his sister, A. Hazel Duff, No. 12 Olive Grove, Norwood, S. E. London, in which there were references to money orders.

The ground floor of the Pearl street building is occupied by the Carter's Ink Company. J. Huttie, shipping clerk of the concern, had occasion to go to the basement soon after reporting for work today. He met George Miller, the engineer, near the foot of the elevator shaft and they stopped to talk a moment. Benjamin Lutz, the elevator man, had arrived in the mean time. The elevator car was at the bottom of the shaft. Lutz boarded it and ascended to the first floor. Then Huttie and Miller saw something that had been concealed from their view of the car—the body of a man.

There was a great wound on the right side of the man's head. It was plain that he had fallen down the shaft

and struck on his head on part of the machinery attached to the floor. The steel door of the building was open until late last night and the elevator shaft is only a few steps from the entrance.

The letters found in the pockets of the dead man's shabby clothing were written in a superior quality of stationery and the address was engraved in a corner of one of the sheets. The handwriting is of the fashionable style and the language used by the writer indicates a high degree of culture. In one of the letters which dealt in a quiet way with family affairs the writer remarked that she and her father and mother were about to attend the memorial service to the King and Queen of Portugal.
