

TITUS, IN AUTO, RUNS DOWN BOY IN SCHOOL CROWD

Former Bicycle Rider Rushes His Victim to Hospital, but Lad Cannot Live.

An automobile driven by Fred J. Titus, the former bicycle racer and ex-husband of Edna May, ran over a little boy this afternoon, injuring him so that he will die.

Titus, since retiring from bicycle riding, has been a demonstrator and automobile expert, and comes over every day from his home, No. 48 Pennsylvania avenue, Newark, in a large car.

There is a public school in Forty-fourth street, near Tenth avenue, and Policeman Hayden is stationed to see that the children cross the street safely. Several hundred pupils were returning to school after the mid-day recess, when Titus came up in his car.

PUBLISHER IS OVERCOME BY GAS IN HIS HOME

Edwin Buckney Hall Sent to Hospital and Later Arrested.

Edwin Buckney Hall, a publisher, of No. 317 West Ninety-third street, was taken from his home to the J. Hood Wright Hospital to-day suffering from gas asphyxiation.

The police were not notified in the first instance. A physician in the neighborhood summoned an ambulance, and when Dr. Wainwright arrived at Mr. Hall's beautiful apartment in Eleanor Court, he found the publisher unconscious in the hall.

Until several months ago Mr. Hall was president of the publishing firm of the Hall & Locke Publishing Company, of No. 20 East Twenty-first street. Several months ago the concern sold out to the Young Police Educational League. The headquarters of the concern was in Boston.
