

"POISON" SENT BOMB THROWER, COUGH SYRUP

But Police Will Analyze Contents of Bottle Given by Sister to Silverstein.

Inspector McCafferty is considerably exercised over a small bottle containing a red liquid which Cecilia, the sister of Selig Silverstein, the Union Square bomb-thrower, handed him in Bellevue Hospital yesterday.

The bottle and its contents were turned over today to the chemists of the Board of Health for analysis.

Naturally a close watch has been kept upon Silverstein to keep him from getting hold of poison by which he might end his life. There was no secrecy, however, about the transfer from Cecilia to her brother of the bottle under suspicion and it was apparently simply as a matter of precaution.

Cecilia Silverstein is living at No. 12 Delancey street, and was seen there today by an Evening World reporter. She said that the contents of the bottle are harmless.

"Selig," said the girl, "was very hoarse. He said he had a cold on his chest, and asked me to get him some medicine."

"I went to a drug store at No. 29 Delancey street and paid 20 cents for a little bottle of molinkest, which is good for colds. That is what they think is poison."

Accompanied by the girl, the Evening World reporter went to the Delancey street drug store. The proprietor said that he remembered selling a four-ounce bottle of molinkest to Cecilia Silverstein on Wednesday. Molinkest is an extract of raspberry juice, and is a prime remedy in the throat for hoarseness and lung troubles.

The Board of Health analysis may not be completed before tomorrow. No attempt has been made to interfere with the liberty of the Silverstein girl.

SPEEDS ACROSS OCEAN TO FIND SHE'S A WIDOW

Wm. Wakefield Killed While Awaiting Arrival of Family From England.

There is a woman on the ocean today bound for New York with her two children who does not know that she is a widow, and that her children are fatherless. She will not know until the American liner St. Louis reaches here on Sunday. As she steps ashore with her little ones she will be met by a little delegation of well-wishers and tender-hearted men, who will break the news of her bereavement.

The woman is Mrs. William Wakefield. Her husband was killed last night in the yards of the Pennsylvania Railroad at Long Island City. Wakefield came to New York from London three months ago and secured a position as foreman with the Deegan Construction Company in the work of building the big railroad yards which the Pennsylvania Railroad is to use in Long Island City.

After a few weeks he sent for his wife and children to join him. He had prepared a home for them at No. 153 Academy street, Long Island City, and spent all his spare time in arranging it for their reception. His fellow workmen knew all about his plans, for he

talked continually of the pleasure he felt in the approaching reunion of his family.

A train of dirt cars backed down upon him in the yards last night and cut off his legs. He died a few hours later in St. John's Hospital. The wife and children who expected to rejoin him here will arrive in time to attend his funeral.
