

BANNERMAN DIES AFTER LIFETIME IN PUBLIC OFFICE

Ex-British Premier Succumbs to Malady That Seized Him at Height of Career.

LONDON, April 22.—Sir Henry Campbell-Bannerman, former British Premier, long ill, died at 9.15 o'clock this morning at his official residence in Downing street.

The cause of Sir Henry's death is officially given as heart failure. His demise was peaceful.

Sir Henry Campbell-Bannerman resigned the office of Prime Minister on April 18, suggesting in his letter to King Edward, who was touring at Biarritz, Herbert H. Asquith, Chancellor of the Exchequer, and the then Acting Premier as his successor. Mr. Asquith was summoned at once by the King and received the appointment a few days later.

Campbell-Bannerman's final illness dated from Feb. 12, when he last appeared in the House of Commons, although he had been ill since Nov. 23, 1907, when he participated at an entertainment in honor of King for William at the Guildhall. On Nov. 18, after addressing a political meeting at Bristol, he was seriously stricken with heart weakness, and later influenza was added to his heart trouble, bringing on his fatal illness.

COURT PROBE BILL RUSHED IN SENATE

Hughes Measure Reported by Finance Committee and Immediately Passed.

SENATE, April 22.—The bill of Administration Finance, providing for the appointment of a commission to inquire into the manner in which Justices administered in courts of inferior criminal jurisdiction in New York, Buffalo and Rochester, recommended by Gov. Hughes, was reported by the Senate Finance Committee today and immediately passed by a vote of 54 to 19.

DIES HOURS AFTER BILL STRUCK HER

Autopsy Discloses Heart Swollen to Remarkable Size and Valves Ruptured.

Mrs. Catherine Murray, standing on the sidewalk in front of her home at No. 156 Wallabout street, Williamsburg, yesterday, was struck on the breast by a baseball propelled from the bat of several boys playing in the street. The ball landed just over her heart and she fell.

Three of the boys, including the one who had batted the ball, helped her to her feet. She knew the little fellows and assured them that beyond a slight pain she felt no effects from the blow, but late last night she complained of spasms in the region of the heart, and a physician was summoned. By the time he arrived Mrs. Murray had lapsed into unconsciousness. He found a livid mark on her bosom close to the heart, and diagnosed her case as one of injury to that organ, but was unable to do anything for her. She died at daylight.

Coroner's Physician Weist performed an autopsy. He found the heart swollen to a remarkable size with the walls ruptured in several places. How Mrs. Murray survived the original injury and lived for hours is a mystery to the medical men who have studied the case.


