

POLICE PAID CAUSES DEATH OF CHINAMAN

Lee Buck Tung Found Dead on Floor After Ten Were Arrested.

Capt. McFally and his detectives, of the Eleventh street police station, raided an alleged Pie Gow game last night on the third floor of No. 13 Pell street, and after the excitement was over, and the ten prisoners removed to the station house in a patrol wagon, Lee Buck Tung, a cook, forty-five years old, living on the top floor, was found dead on the floor of his apartment.

The raid was spectacular. One hundred Chinamen were gathered in the room playing their favorite game of Pie Gow, when the police broke down the door and rushed in.

Loy Kong, twenty-five years old, who had been living at No. 173 Woodbine street, Brooklyn, was charged with keeping and maintaining a gambling house, the others with aiding and abetting.

Lieut. Joseph O'Connor, who was in uniform and on patrol, was pressed into service, and rushed to the scene, climbing up to the roof by way of the fire-escape after the fleeing Chinamen, capturing three of them as they made for another floor.

Surgeon Stewart, of Hudson Street Hospital, who was called to attend the dead Chinaman, said he had probably died of fright while escaping.

RICHARD WALSH, MOTHER WANTS YOU

Jersey City Woman Prostrated With Grief by Son's Disappearance.

Prostrated over the continued absence of her eighteen-year-old son, who mysteriously vanished from his home one evening four weeks ago, Mrs. Richard Walsh, of No. 57 Beech street, Jersey City, to-day appealed to The Evening World to aid her in her search.

Since her son's disappearance, Mrs. Walsh moved from the home Richard left at No. 74 Elton street. Richard went out, saying he would return home early. When he did not get home that night Mrs. Walsh began a search which included the homes of her relatives and friends and the hospitals and police stations of Jersey City.

Richard Walsh is tall for his age, though slightly built, with a small oval face. His complexion and hair are light and his eyes light blue. He was dressed in a suit of black and wore a gray top.

Some time ago Richard enlisted in the army without the knowledge of his mother and father. It is her belief that Richard, because of the fascination the sea laid to him, re-enlisted in the navy.
