

COL. G. A. MILLER DIES OF APOPLEXY

Was Law Professor in New York University and Prominent in National Guard.

Col. George Alfred Miller, a member of the New York law firm of Carter, Ledyard & Milburn, died today at his home, No. 186 Grand street, Montclair, N. J., as a result of a stroke of apoplexy he sustained two weeks ago.

Until a year ago Col. Miller was professor of law in the New York University, and for many years was a prominent figure in the militia of New York State.

Col. Miller was born in New York Aug. 29, 1853. He graduated from Columbia College and Columbia Law School. He entered the Twenty-second Regiment as a private and rose to the rank of lieutenant-colonel. During the strike of 1877 he was in the thick of the fight. Later he was transferred to the Twelfth Regiment. Ten years ago he retired from the service.

For a time he was professor of law in the Metropolitan Law School and left there to take up the same work in the New York University. When he retired a year ago the faculty gave him a dinner and he was presented with a loving cup by the students and faculty.

Col. Miller moved to Montclair thirty years ago and took an active part in building up the American Jersey Club, the most exclusive organization of the kind in New Jersey. In 1902 he was the Democratic nominee in his district for Congress, but he was defeated.

Col. Miller married Miss Julia Wainwright, of Boston. He is survived by Mrs. Miller and two children.
