

TERRIER SNAPS AT CHILD AND CAUSES PANIC IN SCHOOL

Policeman Shoots It Before It Gets Farther Than the Vestibule.

Mrs. Charles Vesey, wife of the janitor of the Civic Club in Long Island City, was preparing luncheon to-day when one of her four little children, who had been playing in the yard, rushed in crying and screamed and "Gyp" tried to bite me.

Gyp is a fox terrier which had been the children's playmate for more than a year. Mrs. Vesey went to the door and saw the dog running about in the yard, snapping and with foam flecks about its mouth. She screamed and, gathering the three other children, ran into the house and barricaded the door.

The dog then ran out of the gate and along Jackson street yelping and snapping and causing everyone he met to retreat to the other side of the street. He ran into the yard of the Polish school a few blocks distant and was in the doorway, when a man called to Policeman Ed Phillips, who came along about that time:

There's a mad dog in there. Inside the school the teachers and children were in a panic, but Phillips shot the dog before he got farther than the vestibule. The dog's body will be examined by the Health authorities.

Police Lieut. Louis S. Lewis, attached to the Wakefield station, also shot a dog this afternoon. He saw a crowd of children running from the playground on Richardson avenue, and found a mongrel acting in a peculiar manner.

DYING AFTER BEATING IN HIS OWN YARD.

Bordesky Set Upon by Four Men and Left Unconscious—Neck May Be Broken.

Matt Bordesky, of No. 257 Norman avenue, Williamsburg, was so badly beaten by four men who set on him in the backyard of his home early to-day that it was said in St. Catherine's hospital, where he was taken, that he cannot live. His neck is thought to be broken and he has several contusions and broken bones.

Bordesky went to his cellar to get some wood and had reached the top step leading into the backyard when a man stepped in front of him. Bordesky dropped the wood and tried to run into the house, when three other men appeared and beat him till he was insensible. He was found by neighbors.
