Gracefully they were spinning spools on the cords attached to the wind they wielded, missing the spools and catching them profitably on the humming cords.

Jessie missed catching her spool and rolled down the incline of a path on the hill. She, thinking the path turned at the hill's edge, chased the spool. But the path ended at the edge and Jessie, running as fast as she could, fell over the edge for forty feet.

Numbers of children were playing or sunning themselves on the level under the hill. As wood luck had it, small Miss Jessie hit none of them when she fell. And as her luck had it, she missed an asphalt path by a foot or two and fell on grass which the recent rains had made sodden. But she lay unconscious.

The shrieks of frightened women and scared children brought Patrolman Shanley, of the East One Hundred and Twenty-sixth street station. Dr. Bennett took Jessie to the Harlem Hospital. The surgeons said she was hurt internally and had dislocated her left thigh. But she will get well.
