

DEMOCRATS IN NO HURRY WITH THE CURRENCY BILL

Declare Against a Filibuster, but Intend to Have Their Full Say.

ALDRICH ON RECORD.

Teller and Culberson Get Admissions on Railroad Bonds and Other Paper.

WASHINGTON, May 28.—Despite the fact that a majority of the Democratic Senators today declared against a filibuster on the Currency bill, they began a demonstration against the measure immediately it was called up. Their action showed that they had no intention of letting the bill go through without making at least a little trouble.

Culberson Again.

Mr. Aldrich replied that speaking for himself he believed it was absolutely impossible at this session to pass such a bill because of the great diversity of opinion on the subject.

Again Mr. Culberson interrupted and asked whether a campaign publicity bill could be passed before adjournment, and Mr. Aldrich declared that so far as he was concerned he would favor voting on that matter as soon as the pending currency bill should be disposed of.

A general discussion in the campaign publicity measure followed and when it was ended Mr. Culberson asked whether the currency bill reported to the Senate would allow railroad bonds to be used for securing emergency currency.

Mr. Aldrich replied that it included securities held by any bank provided they were approved by the association and the Secretary of the Treasury.

"It undoubtedly," he added, "provides for the acceptance of railroad bonds as security if approved by the association and by the Secretary of the Treasury."

Not a Filibuster, Says Teller.

Senator Teller declared that the "door was exceedingly wide open in the matter of securities." The House bill joined to the Senate bill, he said, had never been discussed by the Senate and he believed full consideration should now be given it.

"But," he added, "the published statement that I favor a filibuster on this measure is not correct. I do not believe the opponents of this measure should enter into a filibustering procedure."

Mr. Teller called upon Mr. Aldrich for information as to whether cotton warehouse receipts would be accepted as security for emergency notes, and the chairman of the Committee on Finance replied that anything a bank could take as collateral security can be used if approved by the association and by the Secretary of the Treasury, and he concluded that warehouse receipts would be included in the same way mortgages might be included in the approved securities if taken by a bank to secure its loans.

"I object to this scheme," said Mr. Teller, "because I do not believe it will stop with what is proposed in this bill. I know there is a determined effort among bankers to make commercial paper an asset upon which to issue money."

PENAL SERVITUDE FOR DRUCE WOMAN WITNESS.

LONDON, May 28.—Mrs. Margaret Hamilton, who was one of the principal witnesses to the alleged identity of the Duke of Portland with T. G. Druce, was to-day sentenced to eighteen months' penal servitude for perjury, her appeal having been disallowed.

Mrs. Hamilton, who is seventy years old, was arrested March 7 last, charged with willful perjury and conspiracy in connection with the Druce case. She was found guilty at the Old Bailey April 9, but sentence was postponed pending an appeal on points of law.
