

HOLLAND ARMS COLONISTS FOR WAR WITH CASTRO

Active Preparations for Possible Clash in Dutch Possessions Near Venezuela.

WILLEMSTAD, Curaçao, Aug. 11.—The Colonial Government is making active preparations for any possible trouble between the Netherlands and Venezuela. A station for wireless telegraphy is being installed here, and yesterday the cruiser Gelderland left for the neighboring island of Aruba, carrying a number of rifles and ammunition to the inhabitants. Aruba is practically without protection.

A letter received here from Maracaibo announces that the Venezuelan River steamer Felix has left port with a number of troops on board for the head of Maracaibo Bay. It is believed that these soldiers are going out against a revolutionary band.

NOISY POLICEMAN IS FINED IN COURT

Walter E. Robinson, a policeman under suspension, was arraigned before Magistrate Corrigan in the West Side Court today charged with being drunk and causing a disturbance in Harlem last night that took half a dozen policemen on the run to Amsterdam avenue and One Hundred and Sixth street. According to Policeman Michael Murphy, Robinson was vociferously blowing his police whistle. Robinson denied the charge, but was fined \$2 by the Court. Although under suspension, Robinson still retained his police pistol and whistle.

"What were you suspended for?" asked the Magistrate of Robinson. "Oh, it's just one of those gin mill cases," explained Robinson. "It's going to be tried downtown within a few days."

BROKER IN TOMBS ON THREE CHARGES

Charles A. Bliven, of No. 88 Decatur street, Brooklyn, a broker, formerly of the firm of E. F. Hutton & Co., No. 17 Wall street, was arraigned in the Court of General Sessions, today, to plead to indictments charging grand larceny, perjury and forgery in the second degree. Because of the inability of the District Attorney and Bliven's counsel to agree about bail the prisoner was committed to the Tombs until tomorrow when Judge Crane will fix the amount.

Bliven was arrested last April on complaint of Mrs. Harriet N. Kilmer, of Brooklyn, who charged that he appropriated to his own use \$4,000 worth of securities which she had intrusted to him to have transferred from her husband's name to her own. He was discharged in Centre Street Police Court at that time.
