

DRESS PARADE AT SEA ON LABOR DAY

Passengers on the City of Savannah Had Fine Time in Fancy Costumes.

When the steamer City of Savannah tied up at her pier this morning, after a smooth weather voyage from Savannah, the 120 cabin passengers were still talking of a fancy dress parade they had aboard the ship on Labor Day.

From Captain Fisher's fertile brain came the idea. The passengers were all on deck and taking in the glories of a perfect day on the ocean when the captain cast about in his mind for something that would relieve the monotony and give a holiday flavor to the passing hours.

Passengers of both sexes searched their wardrobes for all manner of unusual dress. Kimonos and pajamas were in great demand, and members of the crew were appealed to for jumpers and overalls.

official of the Central Railroad of Georgia, with headquarters in Birmingham. He had donned a suit of pink pajamas over a light pair of trousers, slitting the pajamas to create a sheath effect. A ribbon trimmed sauce pan adorned his head.

Mrs. F. T. Meyer, of Tallahassee, imitating Emma Goldman, in a blue kimono and flowing excelsior locks, won second prize.

The winners were very generous in sharing their prizes with their competitors. A basket of wine was divided among them and the health of Captain Fisher was drunk long and deep.
