

NO DIVORCE DECREE FOR VIRGINIA HARNED

Nevada Judge Holds Up Southern Suit to Ascertain if It Is Prearranged.

RENO, Nev., Oct. 9.—"I don't see why their family troubles should be aired in Nevada if they will not come here in person to testify in the suit that is brought," said Judge Pike, in refusing Virginia Harned's application for a divorce from E. H. Southern. Judge Pike warned somewhat sarcastically when the case was called and neither

party to the case appeared. He said: "If the interested parties do not deem it of enough importance to grace the court with their presence I think I will deny the decree. I should like to question the plaintiff and see if this is prearranged. It is to put it mildly, a peculiar state of affairs when an action of this kind can be brought with the hope of securing the decree without putting in an appearance. I shall not grant the decree, but will hold it under advisement until I can ascertain if Mrs. Southern will condescend to appear and give testimony in the case."

Mr. Southern was not represented in court. Judge Massey represented Mrs. Southern and read depositions from her and Eleanor Rogers, of New York, in support of Mrs. Southern's contentions of desertion and failure to provide.

Virginia Harned, who is playing at Hammerstein's Victoria Theatre, when seen to-day, refused to discuss her divorce case, saying that her acting was the public's business but her private life was her own.

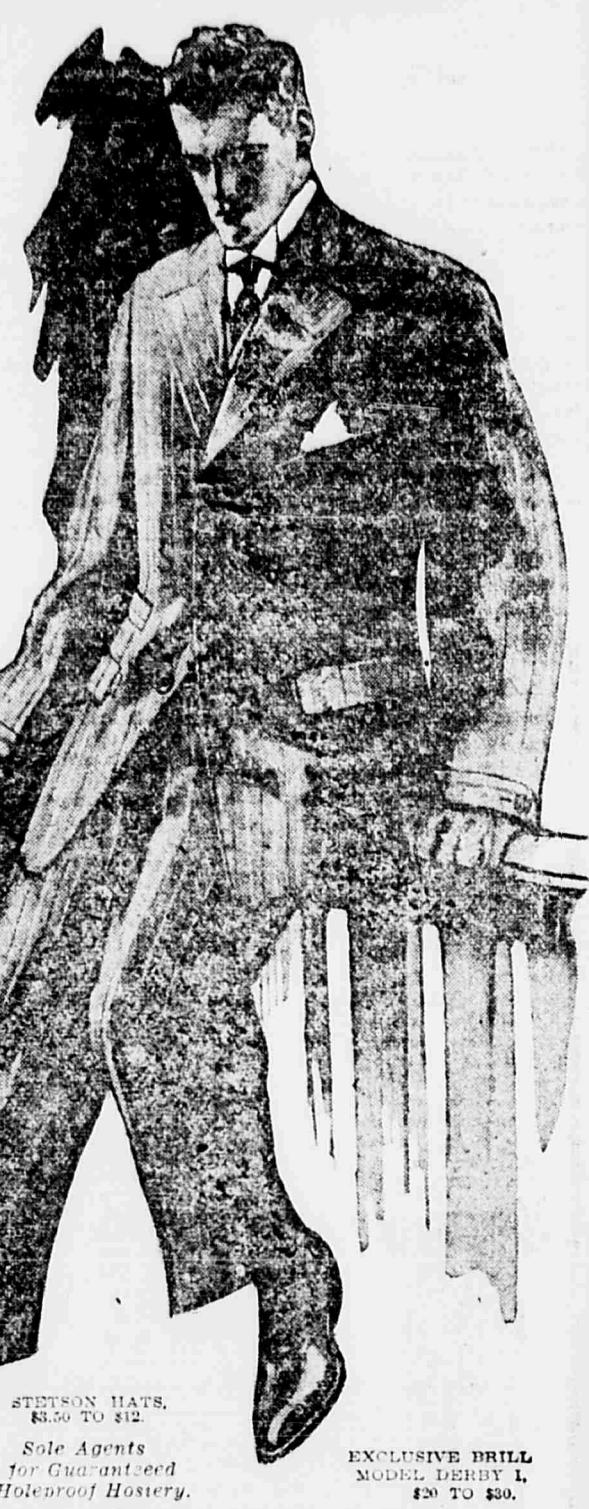
