

### WITNESS AGAINST WHITMORE IN JAIL

Letty Carroll, the important witness who could not be found at the last trial of the Whitmore murder case in Jersey City, was arraigned in Special Sessions, Brooklyn, to-day on a charge of grand

larceny. Catharina Cooper, of No. 192 State street, Brooklyn, charged the girl with stealing a locket and chain worth \$30. The prisoner pleaded that she had been hungry when she committed the theft. Assistant District-Attorney White thereupon recommended that sentence be suspended against her, which was done. She was turned over to Detective Ward, of Jersey City, and will be locked up in that city, pending the next Whitmore trial. At the time Mrs. Whitmore was murdered at Harrison the Carroll girl—she

is nineteen—was living with them. Her testimony is that on the night Mrs. Whitmore was slain Whitmore told her, the witness, that he was going out with his wife and wanted her to look after the house and the dog in his absence.

### HOTEL MEN HELD IN JEWEL THEFT

When John W. Newman, a clerk, and P. J. Costello, a hallboy, of the Hotel Marselles, at No. 236 West One Hundred and Third street, were arraigned in the West Side Court to-day and charged with being concerned in a jewel robbery at the hotel, Newman declared that he was a juror in Part III of the Supreme Court, and was entirely innocent of any complicity in the theft. The jewelry in question was deposited in the hotel safe on Oct. 3 by C. A. Garthside, a guest at the Marselles. When Garthside called for his property—which he valued at \$2,000—it had disappeared, and, although the two employees, who were the only ones that had a key to the safe, declare they know nothing about it, the police arrested them. In court they were held in \$2,000 bail each for further examination.
