

WAGNER'S CAREER LESSON TO YOUNG MAN IN POLITICS

Has Earned Promotion by Persistent Work for Interest of His Constituents.

There is a lesson for every young man interested in politics as a profession in the career of Robert F. Wagner, Democratic candidate for the Senate in the Sixteenth District, which lies up Yorkville way. Mr. Wagner was elected to the Assembly for the first time four years ago and went to Albany with a single purpose.

That purpose was to work primarily for the interests of the people of his district; secondly, for the interests of the people of the State at large. Doubtless a majority of young men who are sent to the Assembly are animated by the same purpose when they start, but a majority of them fall by the way side.

Mr. Wagner stuck to his purpose, with the result that the people he has served so well in the Assembly are going to send him to the Senate for two years. Their object now is to make his election as near unanimous as possible.

Stuck to His Constituents. By his persistency in following the course he mapped out for himself Mr. Wagner gained the ill will of some politicians. A few of these men would have liked to push him back into private life, but they were afraid to take the chance. They knew he had his constituency behind him and therein lies the lesson for young men in politics.

Stuck to your constituents and your constituents will stick to you. Mr. Wagner was born in Germany, but came to New York with his parents when an infant. His father settled in the district in which he is now a candidate. Young Robert went to Public School No. 83, and after school hours on Saturdays sold newspapers in order to help out the not overly plentiful income of the head of the family. After his graduation from No. 83 school the boy Wagner entered the College of the City of New York. He spent five years in that institution, earning his own way part of the time, by acting as a private tutor. On two different occasions he was pronounced the prize debater of the college, and when he graduated in 1886 he was awarded the highest honors. Next he entered the New York Law School, from which he was graduated in 1890. He was admitted to the bar in the same year and immediately entered upon the practice of law as a member of the firm of Mahoney & Wagner, No. 229 Broadway.

In Politics Early.

He was an election district captain as soon as he was old enough to vote and before long had made himself a power in the counties of his district organization. In 1894 they nominated him for the Assembly and he was elected. He served in the Assembly in 1895, 1896 and 1897. During the last session he was a member of the important Assembly Committee on Cities, the majority of which is made up of rural members from up-State. Mr. Wagner, by standing out for the rights of New York City on every occasion when the rural members tried to vote some law over the city people below the Bronx, made himself somewhat unpopular with certain elements in the legislature, but secured almost invariably with the people at home.

He gained a State-wide reputation by introducing and forcing to a passage the Evening World bill calling for a referendum on the City Island. Few bills introduced in the legislature in recent years met with such powerful underground opposition as did this one, and few young legislators have ever been called upon to withstand the political and cooperation pressure that was exerted against Mr. Wagner's bill. Mr. Wagner fought for the bill, and it would be on the statute books today but for the veto of Gov. Hughes. Mr. Wagner introduced another important measure, calling for the regulation of the New York Stock Exchange, but the interests in opposition to this were powerful enough to temporarily smother it.

These achievements measure only a small part of Mr. Wagner's labors in the Assembly, but they attracted the most attention. He is pledged, if elected to the Senate, to reintroduce the Five-Cent Fare bill and the Stock Exchange Regulation bill. Mr. Wagner's personal following in his district is immense. He knows everybody, and everybody knows him. He is President of the Algonquin Club and a member of the New York, the Mount Vernon, the Biltmore, the League, the Irish-American Athletic Club, the New Rochelle Club, and a number of charitable organizations.


