

**BREAKS BOTH LEGS  
BY WINDOW JUMP**

Mrs. Netschke, Victim of Nervousness, Tries to End Life at Mother's Home.

Mrs. Aldina Netschke, wife of Frank Netschke, of Utica, N. Y., leaped from the second-story window of the home of her mother, Mrs. Craft, No. 526 Court street, Brooklyn, at 6 A. M. today, breaking both her legs and injuring herself internally.

Mrs. Netschke, who is thirty-five years old, arrived in Brooklyn yesterday with her husband on a visit. During the early part of the night Mrs. Netschke, who has been in bad health, became nervous.

All the members of the household were sleeping this morning when she stole from bed and, dressing herself in her best gown, went to the bathroom and plunged to the courtyard below.

When Mrs. Netschke was found she was conscious and praying. She could not or would not tell why she had attempted to take her life. At Long Island College Hospital it was said she would die.

Netschke said that his wife was a sufferer from nervous dyspepsia. "I am in business in Utica," he told the police, "and yesterday my wife and I came here in hopes that she would be benefited by the trip. We had planned to go sight-seeing to-day, and have a theatre party to-night. I suppose she had an attack of the nervousness during the early morning hours, and that she became temporarily deranged."

**RICH REAL ESTATE MAN DYING AFTER A FALL.**

Ernest G. Seward, wealthy real estate dealer, with offices in the Fuller Building, who last night fell from the window of his home, No. 192 Claremont avenue, is dying in J. Hood Wright Hospital to-day. There are two fractures of the skull, one at the base and the other in the forehead.

Mr. Seward, who is a bachelor and about forty-two years old, returned home last night to find he had forgotten his keys. He tried to get in through a window, lost his balance and fell to the stone pavement twenty feet below. His fall was heard by neighbors, who sent him to the hospital.

**ROOSEVELT FIFTY YEARS OLD TO-DAY**

**CHAUFFEUR BEATEN,  
TAXICAB BURNED**

Police Charge Both Affairs to "Strikers" and Seek Fullerton's Assaulters.

William Fullerton, a strike breaking chauffeur employed by the New York Taxicab Company, who lives at No. 630 East Seventieth street, is in Roosevelt Hospital with severe injuries after an

assault by two men, supposed to be strikers, in front of the home of Dr. J. C. Ayer, at No. 34 West Seventy-fourth street, at 9:45 o'clock last night.

Fullerton responded to a telephone call to Dr. Ayer's home, where a reception was in progress, and had just stopped his cab when two men leaped out of the darkness and assaulted him. Dr. Ayer heard his cries for help and with some of his guests ran to the street. The two men ran and were not followed. Fullerton was taken into the doctor's house and bandaged up, after which he was sent to the hospital. He was pretty badly hurt. The police have a description of his assaulters.

Mike Cunningham, another strike breaker, picked up a fare in front of the Hotel Marlborough, Thirty-sixth street and Broadway, last night, and was told to drive to Lexington avenue and Forty-second street. The passenger managed to alight from the machine without the chauffeur noticing it, and a few minutes later Cunningham's cab was on fire. It was totally destroyed before the fire engines came.
