

Gossip of the Campaign in Both Local Camps

Lewis Stuyvesant Chanler invades the Bronx to-night, and he is booked to speak in four halls in that borough. There will be a fireworks display and several bands of music at each meeting. Mr. Chanler will appear between 8 and 10 o'clock at:

1. Long's Dancing Academy, Third avenue and One Hundred and Forty-fifth street.
2. Jackson Casino, Westchester and Jackson avenue.
3. Corona Casino, One Hundred and Sixty-ninth street and Boston road (McKee square).
4. Borough Hall, Highbridge.

Leader Arthur Murphy, of the Thirty-fourth District, says the Chanler plurality in the Bronx will be close to 20,000.

SPLIT MAY GIVE SAXE'S SEAT TO A DEMOCRAT.
Joseph S. Schwab is putting up a red hot fight on his Republican opponent, Alexander Brough, for Senator in the Eighteenth District, which includes the territory from Sixty-fourth to One Hundred and Sixth street, west of Central Park.

"I believe I can win because of the split in the opposition's ranks," said Schwab. "Brough is a lawyer for the Beef Trust, and was given the nomination in place of Martin Saxe, despite the demand for the latter's renomination."

Schwab has been endorsed by the West Side Taxpayers' Association and the Harlem Property Owners' Association.

Chief Edward E. Lee, of the Colored Democracy, will be the chairman of the negro voters' meeting at Carnegie Lyceum to-night. Lewis S. Chanler will be the last speaker of the evening. Rhineland Waldo, candidate for Congress, will also address the meeting.

Owen W. Bohan, running for Assembly in the Eleventh District, is one of the few legislators who had the Citizens' Union approval two years ago. Bohan was beaten by a fusion last year.

Charges are being made in the Harlem congressional fight that the brewers and liquor interests have raised \$50,000 to defeat William S. Bennett on account of his hostility to their business in Congress. Former Police Commissioner McAdoo is Bennett's opponent.

Maurice Featherston's lieutenant says the Twentieth will be the banner district of Manhattan on Nov. 3. While the breach between Murphy and Featherston has been widening steadily, no charges have been made that the "Silent Maurice" knifed a Tammany campaign on election day.

CAMPAIGN MAKES EVEN NAGLE "LOOK THIN."
The following losses in weight have been reported at Tammany Hall since the beginning of the campaign: Percy Nagle dropped twenty pounds. Gene McGuire lost sixteen. Sheriff Tom Foley got rid of twelve. "It's a strenuous game, but my friend Jack Murphy, brother of the Big Chief, gained nine solid pounds in the last month," said Bob DeWitt.
