

## BIG WAVE SOAKS WOMEN IN CABIN ON LUSITANIA

Sea Sweeps Aboard and Pours  
Cataract Down Compan-  
ion Way.

### CAPTAIN'S LAST TRIP.

Brings Miss Watt, His Daugh-  
ter, to Wed Broker and Quits  
Sea for Shore.

The Cunard liner Lusitania docked today, after a voyage in which she experienced what Capt. Watt, her commander, called "real old-fashioned October weather." On Monday and Tuesday last, while it was blowing great gusts and a heavy sea was running, the 600 cabin passengers had to remain in the saloon or take a ducking from the spume that blew over the big ship. At that, most of the 600 were in their cabins, experiencing agonies of sea sickness.

On Tuesday afternoon, several women, among them Lucy Weston, the actress, were sitting at the foot of a companion way, when a giant combor elined aboard and poured in a cataract down the stairway. They were all soaked from head to foot. Another big wave flooded the elevator and put it temporarily out of commission.

### Capt. Watt's Last Voyage.

When the Lusitania was berthed, Capt. Watt's sea life came to an end. He has made his last voyage, he said, and will begin shore life to-morrow by being present at the marriage of his daughter, Miss Helen Watt, who came over on the Lusitania, to Gordon R. Watt, a fourth cousin. The wedding will be celebrated at the Fifth Avenue Baptist Church, by Dr. Aked, the pastor.

Miss Watt met her cousin about a year ago while she was on a trip in this country. He is a Chicago fruit broker, and the son of an old sailing shipmaster who amassed a fortune after he had left the sea for a Virginia plantation. Miss Watt has devoted the last six years to nursing. She was for six years in charge of the nurses at the Royal Southern Hospital, Liverpool, and more recently was the surgical sister at the Edinburgh Hospital of the Church of Scotland Deaconesses.

Balloon Castaways Arrive.  
M. H. Arnold and H. J. Hewat, who

piloted the balloon St. Louis in the recent Berlin races and were picked up in the North Sea, were among the passengers.

"It was a terrible experience," said Mr. Arnold to-day, "we were blown along in the dark, through a heavy sea, at ten miles an hour. To add to our misery, we could see the lights of houses along the shore, but knew it was no use to shout, for no one could hear us in the gale."

"At last we saw the lights of a ship coming toward us. She turned out to be the German pilot boat Wagoner. They couldn't come close enough to take us off, however, and we had to climb out of the basket and drop into the sea. Then they threw us ropes and took us on board."

### KILLED HIMSELF IN SIGHT OF WIFE AND HER MOTHER.

Alexander Degenhardt, twenty-five, a Harlem bartender, blew out his brains in the presence of his wife and her mother last night in the latter's flat, at No. 34 East One Hundred and Twenty-fifth street.

Degenhardt had until recently lived with his wife and baby at No. 63 Henry street, Long Island City. A few days ago his wife left him because of his intemperate habits and went to live with her mother, Mrs. Elizabeth O'Neil. She had refused to yield to his pleading to return to him when he shot himself.
