

### BURGLAR DROPPED \$4,000 GEMS AFTER DARING ROBBERY

Booty From Taylor House in Newark Found Among Shrubbery.

Nearly all the jewelry stolen last night from the home of James G. Taylor, No. 212 Ballentine Parkway, Newark, was found this morning in shrubbery, about 200 feet from the house. It was wrapped in a sweater belonging to Mrs. Taylor, and had evidently been dropped there by the thief in his flight.

No clue to the second-story man who committed the robbery has been found. Mr. Taylor is manager of the W. and J. Sloane store on Broadway, Manhattan. He and Mrs. Taylor and a friend were on the parlor floor last night when they heard somebody moving about upstairs. Mr. Taylor ran up and saw a man climbing out of a window.

### METZ AXE SWINGS AT 300 SULLIVANITES

"Little Tim" Holds Up Municipal Research and Comptroller Makes Threat.

Municipal research accountants in the finance department who are being paid by the city will not lose their jobs, even if the Sullivan men want their heads chopped off. Comptroller Metz today made the declaration, with this addition: "I'll lay off 150 clerks to-morrow and 140 more next Saturday, unless my request for an appropriation of \$30,000 now before the Board of Aldermen is acted upon favorably."

"Little Tim" Sullivan learned of the purpose for which the Comptroller needed the money. He was the Bowery statesman's retort. "Pigeonhole that resolution. Those municipal research fellows can go hang for their coin. They should be discouraged from snooping around. They ain't patriotic." Comptroller Metz declared he would get the money, even if it became necessary to lay off 200 clerks. "And they will all be Sullivan men, too," the Comptroller is alleged to have said.

Unless the two forces compromise, 300 Sullivan men will be minus jobs in a week.

TWO KILLED IN TRAIN WRECK.

DUBOIS, Pa., Nov. 6.—Engineer S. M. Miller and William Green, a twelve-year-old boy, were scalded to death and William Green, eighteen years old, was fatally burned yesterday when a number 1 train on a branch of the Buffalo and Susquehanna Railroad made a wild dash down a steep grade near Medix Run and jumped the track.

### STEEL LEADS IN JUMP OF STOCKS ON TAFT'S TALK

There was a heavy rush of speculation in the stock market to-day which swept prices to a higher level in a sensational manner. Steel common going to 54, the highest in seven years.

Commission houses reported a large influx of buying orders from Western sources and from large Eastern cities. The industrial stocks were conspicuous in the movement, the iron and steel issues being in heavy demand for accounts of the industrial centres of activity in those lines.

The speech of Judge Taft assuring non-interference with honest corporations was given as a motive for the buying. Reports of the placing of large orders in industrial lines were alleged, while activity in the metal market helped.
