Last year the honors were carried off by a foreign team, Walter Britt, of Germany, and Johann Stol, of Holland, being the winners.


With this record of first and third place gained last year the foreign delegation hope to repeat and have brought over a team of pluggers, Faber and La-fourcade, who will go after a record.

Evolution of the Racing Bicycle.




GANNON KOCKS OUT MEYERS IN SECOND ROUND.

Modern Cycle Is an Airship Compared With the Pneumatic Vehicle of Other Days.

DURING the running of the six-day bicycle race in the Garden next week, the question more likely to be heard than any other is whether those among the fifteen teams who can stand the gruelling pace in the test of the final days, when stamina counts, are not showing greater endurance than those who first brought the six-day record to America.

Conditions are vastly different today from those of 20 years ago. The modern bicycle, pneumatic tired and weighing only 22 pounds, is an air ship compared to the 60-pound high-wheeled bicycle of 1888.
