

### GOV'S TRIAL FOR WRECK OF BOROUGHS BANK IS BEGUN

Indictments for Alleged Thefts of \$375,000 and Over-drafts of \$108,000.

### CASE LONG DELAYED.

Maxwell, Also Indicted, Killed Himself Facing Same Charges.

William Gow, advertising man and capitalist, who was a director and majority stockholder in the Borough Bank of Brooklyn, when that bank succumbed in the panic of October, 1907, was placed on trial for grand larceny to-day before Justice Crane in the Criminal Branch of the Supreme Court, Brooklyn.

### \$375,000 Larceny Alleged.

The indictment that figures in the present trial names only Gow and Maxwell. It charges that, acting under instructions from Gow, Maxwell turned over \$250,000 of the Borough Bank's money to the Oriental Bank Sept. 30, 1907. This sum was drawn out of the Borough Bank on a note signed "The Borough Bank, per H. Maxwell."

### Trial Long Delayed.

Martin W. Littleton, who is Mr. Gow's attorney, had succeeded in having his client's trial put off from time to time, so that it is now more than a year since the five indictments were found against him.

Gould, as the Charter Revision Commission's sub-committee on debt limit, sent a communication to the Mayor last week making the claim that certain special and trust funds amounting to about \$12,500,000 had been considered as assets by the city.
