

# NEW LEADER IN EVENING WORLD BEAUTY CONTEST

Three Girls Who Head the List Have More Than 4,000 Votes Each.

CONTEST ENDS FEB. 20.

Last Coupon Will Appear in The Evening World on February 13.

Voting is on in real earnest among Evening World readers, as the balloting in the Charles Frohman American Beauty Chorus Contest for places in "The Dollar Princess" shows. Yesterday's announcement showed ten contestants with more than 1,000 votes each. To-day's, which includes the ballots up to yesterday, shows seventeen have passed that mark, and the contest is just getting properly under way.

No. 50, who has been in the lead since the votes were first tabulated, is in second place to-day, No. 48 having jumped from fifth place, and leads this morning by 773 votes.

**Equal Chance for All.**  
A few letters have come to The Evening World with the complaint that the girls whose pictures were printed first have an unfair start over those printed later. In this connection it should be pointed out that the original plan of selecting only twenty-four girls as the final competitors was increased to 100, so as to give as many girls as possible an opportunity to win the splendid prizes. All of these pictures have been printed, and as the standing of the vote to-day shows one of the later contestants in the lead, the chances of all are in reality the same, taking into consideration the fortunes and chances of a friendly battle of this character.

Votes can be sent singly or in packages, as the candidate or voter prefers. The Evening World lays down no rule in the matter, except that the candidate's number must be on each vote and all votes must be in this office by noon Feb. 20.

The voting coupon will be printed in The Evening World on page 2 every day until Feb. 13.

The twelve girls who secure the largest number of votes will be handed

over to Charles Frohman, who, after a term of instruction in stage work, will make them members of the company he will present in "The Dollar Princess" in this city next August. Each girl will be given a year's contract with Mr. Frohman at \$5 a week.

# KEIRAN IN COURT IN SUIT BROUGHT TO END COMPANY

No Action to Be Taken in Matter, However, Till After Bankruptcy Hearing.

Patrick J. Keiran, the ex-president of the Fidelity Funding Company which failed for about \$5,000,000 and involved St. Mary's Convent in Nauvoo, Ill., and numerous other Catholic institutions scattered throughout the country, was sworn before Justice Erlanger in Part II of the Supreme Court to-day in the insolvency proceedings begun by the State for the dissolution of the company.

Keiran went to the court-house accompanied by his counsel, Moses A. Cramer of Buffalo. There were also present Frank L. Crocker, attorney for the petitioners; Robert C. Morris, Jr., Federal receiver for Keiran personally, and Thomas F. Gilroy, Jr., receiver for the Fidelity Funding Company in the State proceedings.

After the brief ceremony of being sworn Keiran, who is a well dressed

man of pleasing appearance and manner, left with his lawyer. He said he had no statement to make and Mr. Shire said there had been no further developments.

The matter will not come before Justice Erlanger again until after an examination Tuesday, at No. 42 Broadway, before Receiver Morris and the examination in the bankruptcy proceedings before United States Commissioner Alexander, postponed from yesterday to Wednesday at noon. At this examination Keiran has promised to produce the books and records of his company and to turn them over to the referee.

Before going to the Supreme Court, Keiran, the receiver and the lawyers went to the office of Peter B. Olney, referee in the bankruptcy proceedings, appointed by the Federal Court. Keiran was also sworn there by Mr. Shire, asked for an adjournment on the ground that his client had received a summons from the State Court, and Mr. Olney consented.
