

LADY CONSTANCE, BARE TOE DANCER, TO FOUND SCHOOL

Scottish Noblewoman to Take Pay for Showing Her Tootsies at Dinners.

PURPOSE CHARITABLE.

Greek Whirls in Scant Skirts to Raise Fund to Educate Boys.

The "bar-foot" dancing craze has struck the nobility. Lady Constance Richardson, who has won fame as a pig sticker in Northern Africa, a tiger killer in India, and a swimmer at Palm Beach, and who is a sister of the Countess of Cromartie, has been capering without the sign of a stocking, and in scanty Greek skirts, just like Pandora Duncan, for \$500 a night, and has announced that she intends to keep it up.

Lady Constance has twined and pirouetted without stockings at several entertainments given by New York society folk, chief among them being dinner parties recently given by Mrs. W. K. Vanderbilt Jr. and Mrs. James A. Burden.

The enthusiasm of the guests over her ladyship's dancing convinced her that she had hit upon a novelty and decided her to become a professional. Her first professional appearance will be at a dinner to be given in a few days by Mrs. Tiffany.

Lady Constance says she is embarking on this terpsichorean campaign in order to raise enough money to found a model school for boys in Scotland. She doesn't believe that the average boys' school gives sufficient attention to athletics and the outdoor life, and as she is one of the world's best known women athletes and has lived outdoors a lot she aims to be a pioneer in the movement of educating the young along these lines.

Her Husband Approves. Sir Edward Richardson, her husband, with whom she lives at the Hotel Brevoort, having moved there recently from the St. Regis, is in sympathy with her educational ideas and is evidently quite complacent regarding her dancing "bar-foot."

"I shall take five nice boys to my school in Scotland," says Lady Constance. "I think it will be ripping. I don't think the schools here go in for athletics as much as they should and I shall teach my pupils all sorts of outdoor sports as well as agriculture, dancing and the usual studies. I shall also pay great attention to making every lad an expert swimmer, as there is no exercise which so develops and beautifies the human form."

Lady Constance said she hasn't enough money now to start the school, but fully realizes that there are hundreds, especially in this country, who are curious to see her dance, and she is perfectly willing to gratify their curiosity for cash. And she gently intimates that it isn't every day that rich Americans have the opportunity to see a daughter of the nobility of Scotland prancing about without slippers or stockings.

Made Bathers Gasp. Classical dancing in scant Greek draperies is not the first nor the least of her ladyship's unconventional acts. When she appeared at the swimming contests at Palm Beach two years ago she wore a bathing costume that made some of the other contestants gasp, but she didn't mind a bit, and she won several prizes.

Another occasion when she caused a surprise by her liberal ideas regarding clothing was at a ball given last March in the Gezireh Palace, in Cairo. She appeared as a cyce, a sort of outrunner in Oriental countries. He is supposed to be fleet of foot, athletic, a modern Mercury, and naturally he wears as few clothes as possible, going barefoot and barelegged. Lady Constance made up appropriately for the part, neglecting no detail.

The school in Scotland is to be an exclusive institution. "I shall select five of the nicest boys I can find," says Lady Constance, "and I shall give each one my most careful personal attention. Their life shall be spent almost entirely outdoors and I know my experiment will turn out five real men. I am so interested in the work that I am willing to keep on dancing like a whirling dervish until I have raised enough money."
