COURT SILENT ON SCHARFF SENTENCE

Judge Malone, Who Sent Man to Sing Sing, Refuses to Discuss Matter.

In response to the requests of the reporters that he make a statement regarding his action in sending Joseph Scharff, of No. 131 1-2 Stanton street, to Sing Sing to serve a suspended sentence, Judge Malone, of General Sessions, through his secretary, handed out the following to-day:

"Judge Malone presents his compliments to the gentlemen of the press, but begs to be excused from giving out an interview. He regards it as highly unethical for a judge to pass publicly upon the merits of a matter which in some phase or other may come before him for judicial action."

Scharff is a glazier who pleaded guilty some months ago to the abduction of a girl and had been sentenced to Sing Sing for not less than four or more than four and a half years. He was let go upon his solemn promise to marry the young woman and care for her properly.

He did marry the young woman, but a few days ago the wife came to Mrs. E. S. Walker, the probation officer of the General Sessions, complaining that Scharff was failing to provide for her. Thereupon he was re-arrested and Judge Malone ordered him to serve the original sentence. For the alleged severity of the punishment which he inflicted the Judge had been criticized in one or two papers.


