

TRIBUTE TO TAFT BY ROOSEVELT IN INAUGURAL BOOK

Man of Rare Courage, High Character and Sound Training, Writes President.

WASHINGTON, Feb. 24.—A remarkable feature of the "Inaugural souvenir" issued by the committee in charge of the inaugural ceremonies is a biographical sketch of President-elect Taft by President Roosevelt.

"No man of better training, no man of more dauntless courage, of sounder commonsense and of higher and finer character has ever come to the Presidency than William Howard Taft."

The President in concise terms prefaces this statement with a history of the President-elect, touching simply upon the public achievements of the man.

"There are too many men in public life in private life who will not stand by their convictions in time of stress, and there are also not a few who, having the right convictions and the courage to stand by them, nevertheless put them forward in the most offensive manner."

After twenty years of almost continuous service in Congress, it is a very significant tribute to a man to be able truthfully to say that he has no enemies on either side of the House.

FOURTH FIREBUG BLAZE STARTED IN FLATBUSH

DOUBLE EXECUTION IN CONNECTICUT PRISON

Men Killed D. D. Sheehan in New Haven While He Was Out With His Fiancee.

WETHERSFIELD, Conn., Feb. 24.—The first double execution held in the State prison here took place early this morning when Giuseppe Campagnolo, thirty years of age, and Raffaele Carfaro, twenty years of age, were hanged for the murder of David D. Sheehan in New Haven on the night of Aug. 15 last.

12 LIVES LOST IN SOUTHERN STORM

MEMPHIS, Tenn., Feb. 24.—That the storm of wind and rain which prevailed in the Arkansas, northern Mississippi and western Tennessee was most severe is confirmed by to-day's advices, although, as wires are prostrated, the full loss of life and damage to property is not known.

At least a dozen persons were killed. The town of Fisher, Ark., was practically destroyed. Six persons were reported killed and a number of others injured. Near Augusta the dead number six and others were injured.
