### MURDER CHARGE AGAINST CASTRO IN VENEZUELA

Court Asked to Have Him Extradited from Europe for Killing of Gen. Paredes.

CARACAS, Monday, March 15. Via Wilhelmstad, Island of Curacao, March 15.—Suit has been brought in the High Federal Court of Venezuela against Cipriano Castro, the former President of the Republic, who is now in Europe, on the charge that he caused the murder, in February, 1907, of Gen. Antonio Paredes and a number of his revolutionary companions. The plaintiff is Manuel Paredes and the action was entered five days ago.

Manuel asks the judge to extradite Castro and impose the maximum sentence of fifteen years imprisonment. He presents proofs that Castro issued the order to kill Antonio Paredes from his sick bed at Nicotia.

Antonio Paredes and several companions were killed while prisoners of war. He led a futile revolution against President Castro, landing at Padernales on Feb. 5, 1907. He and his men were captured by Castro's troops and a few days later all were summarily shot.

**FIRST INDIAN CONVICTED.**  
Goes to Prison in Washington for Killing a Man.

WASHINGTON, March 16.—For the first time in the annals of the criminal court of the District of Columbia an Indian, Robert McChillo, was yesterday sentenced by Justice Gould to serve twenty years in the penitentiary on his plea of second degree murder. He was indicted for murder in the first degree in connection with the killing of Carl Pink last October here by hitting the latter over the head with a bludge of wood.

The sentence imposed upon McChillo, who is a full-blooded Anishobee Indian, was the minimum under the law. He is sixty-eight years of age.

**TOOK TUMOR FROM BRAIN.**  
Boy Will Regain Full Health if He Survives Operation.

WASHINGTON, March 16.—What is pronounced a feat in surgery was an operation on the brain of Russell Dullin, an eleven-year-old lad, performed at Georgetown Hospital yesterday. The boy's brain was seriously impaired be-

cause of a tumorous growth and this produced something akin to a paralytic condition. The right lobe of the brain became affected more than a year ago and the boy's left side suffered a stroke of paralysis. His condition recently became dangerous.
