

WOMAN REMAINS IN BLAZING HOME WITH SICK CHILD

Mrs. Schamberg Found by Policeman at Side of Unconscious Daughter.

Unable to carry her sick daughter to safety, Mrs. Yvette Schamberg remained at her bedside as smoke filled the room and flames curled about the hallway and doors until Policeman Boehm burst into the room and rescued them from a fire at No. 102 Essex street at 2 A. M. to-day.

The building is a three-story and basement remodeled into a Turkish bath, of which Joseph Gonsky is proprietor. He occupied the entire place except two rooms on the second floor, where Mrs. Schamberg lived and had an employment agency.

Groped Through the Smoke. Policeman Boehm had sent in an alarm when some one remembered that Mrs. Schamberg and her sick daughter had not been seen.

He found the mother frantically trying to lift her unconscious daughter, and declaring that she would die with her unless help came.

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The forty families came out with a rush, adding to the excitement and confusion in the street, where reserves from the Eldridge street station had gathered.

Rose Schamberg, the sick girl, was taken to the Beth Israel Hospital in Cherry street in a critical condition.

At Engine No. 17 was returning to its quarters in Broome street at 2:30 A. M. the horses suddenly stopped in front of No. 8-10 Livingston street.
