

## RABBI RESIGNS TO ESCAPE 'BRIDLE' ON HIS SERMONS

The Rev. Dr. Benjamin A. Thiner, rabbi of the Temple B'nai Jehoshua, Madison avenue and Sixty-fifth street, has resigned, giving as his reason that he has been bridled as to his sermons, his tenure of office and the church finances.

He is the third rabbi to quit B'nai Jehoshua in ten years. Four years ago the late Rabbi Joseph Mayer Asher left, giving about the same reasons as Dr. Thiner gives. Before that the Rev. Dr. Stephen S. Wise resigned and went to Portland, Ore., afterwards returning to New York to organize the Free Synagogue.

Dr. Thiner's resignation has been accepted, to take effect Jan. 1, and he was voted a gift of \$1,000. He will go to Europe for a month, and on his re-

turn organize a free synagogue in Brooklyn, between One Hundredth and One Hundred and Fifteenth streets. He says it will be free in the matter of speech. He is twenty-nine years old and a graduate of Columbia.
