

**TURKS ROUT REBELS  
KILL 450 IN FIGHT  
NEAR THE DEAD SEA**

Make Prisoners of 600 Bedouins Who Had Slain Many Government Troops in Revolt.

CONSTANTINOPLE, Dec. 28.—Turkish troops sent against the Bedouins have driven the revolvers out of the El Kerak district in the vilayet of Syria, near the Dead Sea, after a sanguinary engagement. Official advices received here today state that in the battle the Bedouins lost 450 killed, while 600 were taken prisoners.

The Turkish losses were seven officers and seventy-seven men.

The Bedouins started the revolt some weeks ago in revenge for the killing of one of their tribal chieftains. Government troops sent to disarm the rebels met with stout resistance. Reinforcements were ordered to the scene, but in the meantime the Bedouins attacked Turkish garrisons at different points and killed hundreds of the troops.

The Christians were spared by the rebels, but a party of American tourists, most of them from Chicago, were held up and robbed a fortnight ago. None of the Americans, however, were harmed physically by the Bedouins.

**IN JAIL AS FAMILY STARVED.**

OGDENSBURG, N. Y., Dec. 28.—Robert Plumb, whose wife and children were found yesterday starving in Brooklyn, formerly lived here. He comes of a highly respected family. His mother and two brothers and one sister reside in this city.

One of his brothers is a jeweler. The other is captain of a large lake steamer. On Nov. 15 of last month Plumb was arrested at Heuvelton, a nearby village, charged with intoxication. At that time he was writing threatening letters to members of the family demanding money. He was sentenced to thirty days in the county jail.

His brother Harry later gave him a omnibus book and \$25 and he was told to return to New York.

**FIRE STAMPEDES  
75 WOMEN FROM  
LODGING-HOUSE**

Seventy-five women in the Women's Lodging House, Nos. 8-10 Livingston street, ran from their rooms this morning when fire started in the narrow alleyway separating the lodging house from Mills Hotel No. 2, at Livingston and Chrystie streets.

Some tramp sleeping in a barn used for the storage of wagons is believed to have started the blaze. Smoke poured from the frame structure and the cry of "Fire!" sounded through the lodging house. None of the women took time to dress, and they fled to the street screaming. There were 600 men asleep in the Mills Hotel. Some of them were aroused and joined the women.

Capt. Day and the reserves came from the Eldridge street police station and restored quiet. The firemen got the blaze out after a wagon had been destroyed. Then the women went back to their cots and the men returned to the Mills Hotel.
