DEFENSE CALLS LAST WITNESS IN SCHENK TRIAL

Rests Its Case, but Prosecution Will Call 100 More to Refute Testimony.

CHARLES TAFT TO DINE RUNAWAY LEGISLATORS.

Honor Taken to Mean That President Sides With West Virginia Senators in Fight.

CINCINNATI, O., Jan. 21.—Charles P. Taft is to entertain the fifteen exiled West Virginia Senators who are in Cincinnati at a dinner and an evening of art to-morrow night. This recognition given them by the brother of the President is taken by the runaway Senators to indicate that the Administration is with them in their refusal to enter the West Virginia chamber until the Democrats make concessions concerning two state Senatorial seats which they are contesting.

The Senators expect to continue their exile in Cincinnati at least until Monday when the West Virginia Legislature reconvenes. They expect that early in the week negotiations for a compromise will be completed.
