

GIRL ABDUCTED BY LOVER SAVED BY TAXI DRIVER

Four Kidnappers Captured in Brooklyn After Seizure in East Side Tenement.

CHAUFFEUR HEARD CRY.

Young Lochinvar Planned to Make Sixteen-Year-Old Operator Marry Him.

What Jack London, the novelist, called the primordial instinct in man, prompted Natalie Tizerro to seize the girl he desired as his wife and carry her away from her tenement home on the east side by force to-day.

The object of his affections, sixteen-year-old Antonina Sanfratello, are Sicilians and in Sicily the word taken Antonina is the fascination of the mountains on the back of a mile.

A residence of three years in New York, however, incanted Natalie with up-to-date ideas. In his forcible abduction of the girl he coveted he used a taxicab, but the chauffeur happened to be a prosaic American, entirely lacking in primordial instinct or romance.

He spotted Natalie's plot by turning the latter-day Lochinvar and three others who assisted in the abduction over to the police in Brooklyn.

Antonina Sanfratello is a plump, dark and remarkably pretty girl. She lives with her father, Tommaso, her mother, Alfonsa, and a lot of other Sanfratellos in the big, crowded tenement at No. 22 Monroe street.

Among them the most persistent has been Tizerro, who is twenty-one years old and lives at No. 22 Hamilton street. He wanted to marry Antonina the second time he met her. Many times subsequently he proposed marriage, but the girl refused him.

She gave him her final answer yesterday afternoon as they walked in the rain up and down in front of No. 22 Monroe street. She told him she would never marry him.

Muttering the equivalent of "By heavens, I'll have you yet, my proud beauty," or metaphoric words to that effect, Natalie hid himself hence and began to plot.

He plotted with his brother, Salvatore, nineteen years old, and his friends, Gaetano Ligori, twenty-one, No. 22 Hamilton street, and Antonio, nineteen, No. 22 Hamilton street. Between them they formulated a plan to steal the fascinating Antonina, sequester her in a safe place and keep her there until she changed her mind.

Ordered a Taxicab. Natalie left an order at an east side garage to have a taxicab in front of No. 22 Monroe street at 6:30 o'clock this morning. The taxicab was in charge of Chauffeur Joseph Buchman, who was met by the four conspirators. They told him they were members of a wedding party. Ligori and Ferri got into the cab and the two Tizerros entered the hallway of the tenement.

"They knew it was the custom of Antonina to start to work at 6:50 o'clock every morning. She is a sewing machine operator in a shirt factory at No. 119 Wooster street. Taxicabs are a rarity in Monroe street and a big crowd gathered about Buchman's vehicle, but he supposed it was a crowd bent upon witnessing the departure of a wedding company.

Antonina appeared right on time, in company with her friend Mary Gardine, twenty-two years old. As she reached the foot of the stairs the Tizerro brothers seized her. Salvatore wrapped a towel around her face and Natalie caught her about the waist. Struggling and trying to scream, the girl was carried across the sidewalk and thrown into the cab in plain sight of a couple of hundred of gaping spectators.

300 LIVES LOST NEAR MANILA IN TIDAL WAVE SWEEP

Volcanic Eruption Sends Water Rushing On—Villages Put in Double Peril.

MANY BURNED BY LAVA.

Victims Running From Wall of Water Meet Fiery Streams From Crater.

MANILA, Jan. 30.—An American school teacher who has traversed the West shore of Lake Taal telegraphs that five small villages were destroyed by a tidal wave following the eruption of the volcano Mount Taal last Saturday and that not less than 300 persons have been killed in that vicinity. Many were burned in fires started by molten masses.

A consular relief detachment reports that twelve persons were drowned and one killed by lightning at Talimay and that three persons were drowned at Lemery. The Government is hurrying relief trains to the scene.

The eruptions continued to-day. The sky was cloudless and there was no wind, but a muddy rain fell steadily. The natives have abandoned their village homes in the vicinity of Lake Taal and sought refuge in the surrounding hills.

Mount Taal rises 1,650 feet from the center of Lake Taal, Province of Batangas, Luzon. It is the second volcano in importance in Luzon and has experienced eight violent disturbances preceding the present one, since 1709. It has been more or less active from time immemorial. Its most destructive eruptions occurred in 1754 and continued for a period of six months, causing much loss of life and enormous destruction of property.

In 1769 Mount Mayon was in eruption for two months, destroying the towns of Cagsauna and Malinao, together with several villages. In 1814 it burst forth again, destroying five towns. Another eruption occurred in May, 1857, when 400 persons lost their lives. The latest outbreak and less severe was in March, 1900.

The observatory authorities believe that Manila is in no danger, but there is some alarm among the natives who recall the destruction caused by Mount Mayon, the other volcano of Luzon, in 1878. So far, however, Mayon has shown no threatening disturbance.

He was on his way to his home in the Nassau Apartments, No. 3 West One Hundred and Ninth street, from the Catholic Club, and had stepped from an Eighth avenue car. An automobile, the property of A. C. Kimberly, was running northward behind the car and Mr. Conor stopped in front of it.

He was knocked down and pushed along the pavement. Mr. Kimberly took him to his rooms and Dr. Stone, his physician, was summoned. At first it was feared that Mr. Conor had sustained serious internal injuries, but a close examination to-day disclosed that the limit of damage was two broken ribs.

WIDOW PAYS \$100 RATHER THAN TELL ABOUT HER INCOME

Mrs. Dean Settles Part of Judgment When She Finds Reporters at Hearing.

Judge Swann Gives Warning as He Reads Recommendations for Confessed Thief.

After a wrangle of more than two hours Mrs. Teresa Dean, the widow without a mite, who lives at the Waldorf-Astoria on nothing a week, to-day paid \$100 on account of the judgment for \$25 obtained against her by Harry P. Disbecker rather than submit to a further examination in supplementary proceedings. The hearing was then adjourned until Feb. 20 on Mrs. Dean's promise to settle the amount remaining at that time.

Mrs. Dean was to have furnished a list of society women and actresses concerning whom laudatory articles and of whom pictures have appeared in "The Widow," a weekly publication of which she is editor. Charles R. Carruth, counsel for Mr. Disbecker, wanted to question Mrs. Dean as to how much money she received, if any, from this source.

But Mrs. Dean becked the traces at first sight of the newspaper reporters who were awaiting her at Mr. Carruth's office, No. 3 Rector street. She wouldn't submit to the examination. It was an outrage, she said. She would appeal to Court Justice O'Dwyer, who signed the order directing her to appear in supplementary proceedings.

SHIP SUBSIDY GRAFT CHARGES ARE REPEATED. John O. Dodsworth Backs Up Brother and Lawyer for Merchant Marine League Hits Back.

WASHINGTON, Jan. 30.—Declaring that all ship subsidy is graft, but refusing to say that all in favor of ship subsidy are grafters, there being men who honestly favor it, John O. Dodsworth, editor of the New York Journal of Commerce, before the House Ship Subsidy Investigating Committee to-day confirmed much of the testimony of his brother, A. W. Dodsworth, who had told of five different attempts to bribe the paper. Of two of these, the \$40,000 offer and the proposition made by de Lesseps when he was trying to sell the French Panama Canal property to this Government, to-day's witness had a recollection.

Attorney Worthington, for the Merchant Marine League, questioned the witness, declaring that his clients had reason to believe that the whole story of these attempts was a recent plan to cast discredit on those favoring ship subsidy legislation.

RENEW WRANGLE AS MONTGOMERY TRIAL GOES ON

Lawyers, as Before, Enliven Court Proceedings by Continual Verbal Warfare.

Judge Swann Gives Warning as He Reads Recommendations for Confessed Thief.

The trial of William R. Montgomery, president of the Hamilton Bank, at the time it failed in the 1907 panic, was again enlivened to-day with a continuous scrap between Assistant District Attorney Frank Moss and James W. Osborne, Montgomery's counsel.

Since the trial started a week ago the two lawyers have bickered bitterly. No many accusations and imprecations have passed between the lawyers that some of the spectators have become confused as to whether Montgomery or the lawyers are on trial. The two lawyers got into the first wrangle to-day over the testimony of Martin McHale, a city real estate appraiser, who was recalled by Mr. Moss. McHale on Friday testified that the real estate Montgomery gave as security for the loan he obtained was worth at the time \$40,000. As the amount of money borrowed on this particular piece of real estate was \$49,000, Mr. Osborne gloated over this testimony, coming as it did from a witness for the prosecution.

To-day Mr. Moss recalled McHale and asked him if he knew the property sold in 1907 for \$55,000. Mr. Osborne was up in the air at once. "I object, I object," he shouted. "The idea of the District-Attorney attacking his own witness. It's a shame."

Mr. Osborne started to say something else when Mr. Moss interrupted, appealing to the Court to suppress the fiery Southerner. Judge Rosalsky tried to soothe the Mr. Osborne, but in vain.

"When these manifold explosions stop," yelled Mr. Moss, referring to his adversary's remarks. "I'll proceed with the case."

"Never mind the explosions," Mr. Osborne, shouted back, "get down to facts."

Mr. Moss sat down. Judge Rosalsky pounded his gavel. "Can't help it, Judge, ejaculated Mr. Osborne, "just can't help it—my blood boils with indignation, sir."

SEVEN SOFT SNAPS TAKEN FROM COPS. Had Easy Berths for Years "Sucking Their Thumbs," as the Mayor Said.

Mayor Gaynor to-day increased Commissioner Crosey's immediate command by seven patrolmen, who for years, the Mayor said, had been drawing salary for "sucking their thumbs" at the Board of Elections. They were sent back to the Commissioner to do real police work.

Thursday last the Mayor sent a communication to the Board of Elections stating that he had found by inquiry that these seven policemen had been detailed to the board: Daniel A. Hart, Thomas J. Murphy, Samuel A. Magrath, John T. Scanlon, James G. Cavanagh, James E. McElrath and Denis Cavanagh. The Mayor demanded to know what these policemen were doing. The board met, went into executive session and informed the Mayor that the board or any one connected with the board could explain why the policemen were detailed, except to perform nominal service. Thereupon the Mayor ordered that the men be sent back to the Commissioner.

Policeman Indicted as Slayer. James T. Welsh, the policeman of the West Thirtieth street station who was arrested for the killing of Lucie Cabanot in West Twenty-eighth street the night of Nov. 25, was indicted by the Grand Jury to-day for manslaughter in the first degree. Welsh was arraigned before Judge Swann in the Court of General Sessions and, through his counsel, J. T. McManus, pleaded not guilty. Bail was fixed at \$5,000, which was furnished.

PENSION FUND FOR CITY WORKERS PROVIDED IN BILL

All Greater New York Employees Who Have Seen Ten Years' Service May Benefit.

ALBANY, Jan. 30.—Assemblyman Louis Civil'ier to-day introduced a bill providing a pension fund for all city and county employees within the limits of Greater New York. Its provisions are voluntary and include all employees whether civil service or exempt. It is patterned on the Baltimore system, and is in a measure a mutual pension and insurance plan. The bill provides for the establishment of a retirement fund of which the Comptroller is to be the custodian.

The fund is to consist of all moneys received from donations, leases, gifts, bequests or otherwise for or on account of the fund and of deductions from the salaries of those entitled to participate in its benefits. There is created a retiring board consisting of the Mayor, the Comptroller and the Chamberlain, with the general jurisdiction and authority to pass on questions as to the retirements under the act and as to what persons shall be entitled to participate in the fund. The amount paid from the fund in any one year must not exceed its income or resources for that year.

Persons who are fifty years of age and who have performed an aggregate of thirty years' service, five of which must have been the five years immediately preceding their retirement, upon their own application shall be retired with an annuity equal to one-half the amount of the average annual salary for the three years immediately preceding retirement.

Those so retiring who have served less than thirty years are to receive an annuity of an amount proportionate to the time they have served. The retiring board has power upon its own motion to retire persons who have served for ten or more years, and who have become mentally or physically incapable, upon an annuity proportionate to the time they have served.

The percentage of salary to be deducted and paid into this fund is graduated according to the term of service of the employee and ranges from 1 to 6 per cent. No annuity can be over \$2,000.
