MILLER TOOK A BOMB TO FIRE HEADQUARTERS.

He Is an Inspector in the Bureau of Combustibles and Waldo Suspended Him.

Charles R. Miller, an inspector in the Bureau of Combustibles, was suspended to-day by Fire Commissioner Rhinelander Waldo for taking into Fire headquarters a dynamite bomb that might have killed every one in the building.

The bomb was made of an eight-inch pipe, with dynamite packed in successive layers with cement and then bound in tin. It had a time fuse forty-two inches long attached to it, and made a most formidable implement of concentrated destruction. The bomb had been found in a dwelling in East Twenty-ninth street on Feb. 5. Miller, who had been sent to get the bomb, should have taken it to the magazine at East River and sixty-eighth street.
