Vanerbit, at Constantinople, whom she claims she is soon to marry. The other was to Milton H. Cook of San Francisco, who, she said, is her cousin. At the Holland House it was said Miss Taaffe had not been a guest there.

COTTON BROKER REPORTED SLATED FOR CROPSY'S JOB

DADY IS REGULAR AGAIN.

Court Order Takes the Colonel Out of Prohibition Rank. The shame of Col. Michael J. Dady, which has hung over him ever since he became confined in a polling booth at the First Assembly District of Brooklyn, of which he is the Republican leader, and enrolled as a Prohibitionist, was removed today by a court order. Justice Crane in the Supreme Court granted a writ of mandamus compelling the Board of Elections to take Col. Dady off the water wagon. Justice Crane smiled at the explanation of Col. 
