

MUSIC CUT OUT BY SHUBERTS AT MORE THEATRES

Other Broadway Houses Expected to Follow This Lead in Short Time.

It is probable that a number of Broadway managers will follow the lead of the Shuberts before the present season has advanced very far and will disengage with orchestras in those playhouses in which dramatic pieces are presented.

Experiments are now being made with a new organ which produces all of the strains of the instruments used in the ordinary orchestra.

The demands of the musicians' union in so far as cancelling contracts are concerned have reached a point which is beyond possible acceptance.

Several producing managers sending musical organizations on tour have decided, for the present, to send no musicians along and to depend entirely upon the local orchestras in the cities visited.

At the office of Henry W. Savage it was stated today that the orchestras to be sent out with the "Everywoman" companies would consist of only seven men, as compared with sixteen utilized on the preliminary tour last spring.

The saving to a theatre by dispensing with an orchestra is roughly estimated as amounting to between \$,000 and \$5,000 a year.
